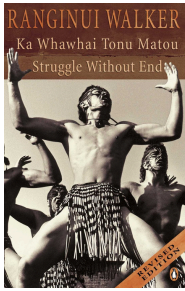
Searching for Te Tiriti o Waitangi resources at Te Aka Mauri

Te Arawa did not sign the Treaty but agreed to its terms in 1860. Like all iwi throughout the country, Te Arawa endure the many negative effects from colonisation. In 2009, the Government formally apologised to Te Arawa for past wrongs, as part of New Zealand's largest ever Treaty settlement. Outstanding claims are still waiting settlement.

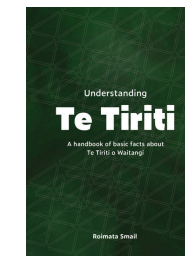
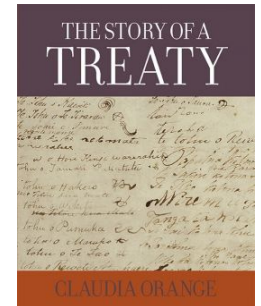
